## Jesus With the Crowds

### LOOK BACK

- **BLESS:** How has the Spirit of God prompted you to reach out to others in the last week or two? What actions or steps did you take?
- **Praise: Psalm 103:2-3:** Give praise to God for WHO He is and WHAT He has done and an affirmation of where our hope is. (How have you seen him work, answer a prayer, bless you or someone else?)
- The language of our faith is thanksgiving in all things. What difficult circumstance in your life will you, by faith, give thanks for?
- **Confession:** How are you prone to be more like Peter and less like Jesus in the midst of crowds?

### LOOK IN

- Read Luke 8:42-48
- How many differences do you observe between the approach of the woman to Jesus and the account recorded in 8:40-42? Why do you think they are so different?
- After the woman was healed, she went from anonymous lady to public speaker. Why do you think Jesus caused this to happen?
- How was the woman's life changed because Jesus healed her?
- Why does Jesus say He healed the woman? What do you think it means to have faith in Jesus?
- What are asking Jesus to do for you?
- What questions, concerns, or doubts do you have regarding what you have heard and read?
- How did the Holy Spirit speak through this passage to inform, remind, convict, or encourage you?

  - Ephesians 2:1-10
  - 2 Corinthians 12:7-12

- Closing Prayer
  - Requests: What are you asking God to do in and through you in the coming week?
