LOOK BACK

- **BLESS:** How has the Spirit of God prompted you to reach out to others in the last week or two? What actions or steps did you take?
- **Praise: Psalm 96:3:** Give praise to God for WHO He is and WHAT He has done and an affirmation of where our hope is. (How have you seen him work, answer a prayer, bless you or someone else?)
- The language of our faith is thanksgiving in all things. What difficult circumstance in your life will you, by faith, give thanks for?
- **Confession:** In the parable of the sower Jesus says that riches, worries, and the cares of this world can choke out fruitful living. What is hindering you from a life of greater fruitfulness in growing the kingdom of God?

LOOK IN

- Read 1 Corinthians 9:19-27. What is the theme of this passage?
- What is the Gospel that motivates Paul?
- What is the prize that Paul desires to win? Why can't the prize be "going to heaven"?
- What is Paul's strategy for winning others in this passage? What would this strategy look like in your life?
- What questions, concerns, or doubts do you have regarding what you have heard and read?
- How did the Holy Spirit speak through this passage to inform, remind, convict, or encourage you?
