LOOK BACK

- **BLESS:** How has the Spirit of God prompted you to reach out to others in the last week or two? What actions or steps did you take?
- **Praise: Ephesians 3:14-21:** Give praise to God for WHO He is and WHAT He has done and an affirmation of where our hope is. (How have you seen him work, answer a prayer, bless you or someone else?)
- The language of our faith is thanksgiving in all things. What difficult circumstance in your life will you, by faith, give thanks for?
- **Confession:** What has the Holy Spirit revealed about a lack of Christ-like love in your life?



LOOK IN

- Read I Corinthians 13:4-7 and note what love DOES.
- How has God been patient and kind with you? How might that encourage you to be patient and kind with specific people in your life?
- What are the burdens that people in your life are carrying that you could help them carry?
- When, if ever, does love stop believing?
- What is the Biblical foundation for a love that hopes?
- What is the key to enduring love?
- What questions, concerns, or doubts do you have regarding what you have heard and read?
- How did the Holy Spirit speak through this passage to inform, remind, convict, or encourage you?

- Closing Prayer
