LOOK IN

Who has God placed in your life that you can pray for, build a better relationship with, or share the truth of Christ with this week?

1. Of the six points/truths in this passage (**One Plan, One Desire, One Truth, One God & One Mediator, One Payment, and One Mission**), which one most challenges or encourages you today, and what specific action will you take because of it this week?
2. Paul says that praying for all people, especially those in authority, is "good and acceptable" to God. What does this passage teach us about God's purposes for prayer? How might it reshape how we pray for leaders?
3. Verse 4 reveals God's desire that ("all men") people will be saved. How does God's heart for all people challenge us to think differently about those who are unlike us, difficult to love, or far from Christ?
4. In our culture, filled with competing voices and beliefs, why is it important for people to come to "the knowledge of the truth"? What essential truths must a person know to come to faith in Jesus Christ?
5. How does the truth that there is only one God and one Mediator between God and mankind shape how we share the gospel with others?
6. What stands out to you about Jesus willingly giving Himself as a ransom for sinners? How should Christ's sacrifice affect the way we view our sin, our salvation, and our gratitude toward Him?
7. Paul saw himself as a preacher, apostle, and teacher sent to proclaim the gospel. In what ways has God uniquely positioned you to reach others?
